QUALIFICATION DESCRIPTION

This qualification reflects the role of workers in a range of community settings and clients' homes, who provide training and support in a manner that empowers people with disabilities to achieve greater levels of independence, self-reliance, community participation and wellbeing. Workers promote a person-centred approach, work without direct supervision and may be required to supervise and/or coordinate a small team.

Have completed CHC33015 Certificate III in Individual Support (Disability) or similar qualification. Students are required to undertake this training on a full-time basis (20 hours per week plus additional hours for the self-study component of the course simultaneously with face to face study).

AEC COURSE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Pre-requisite Academic Requirement

Australian Educare College requires applicants to have completed minimum of Certificate III level qualification in either:

- CHC33021 Individual Support(Ageing)
- CHC33021 Individual Support(Disability)

To maximize students' chance of achieving this qualification, Australian Educare College as an RTO has the following entry requirements which must be satisfied, through verified evidence:

Age Requirement

Must be minimum 18 years or older

Academic Requirement

A minimum of Year 12 from home country,

English Language Requirements

IELTS of 6.0 or an equivalent score

Work-Placement Requirements

Students must have a current Police Clearance as well as child clearance prior to starting their work placement.

CHC43121 Certificate IV in Disability Support course structure is made of 10 units – 7 core units + 3 elective units. The following table provides the course structure and sequence of delivery as trained and assessed by AEC. A total of 7X units are delivered subject wise whilst 3 units are delivered individually as detailed in the table below. The units are grouped together as ‘subjects’ to facilitate the learner’s training and assessment as the learning process overlaps between the given units. Work placement has been scheduled at the end of the last unit training as 1 block to ensure students have had sufficient time to gain the necessary knowledge and practice prior to attending work placement.
